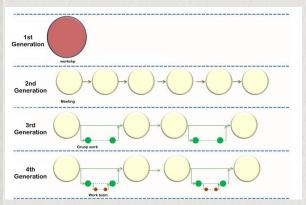


Fig. 1: The levels of the four generations in the personal strategy

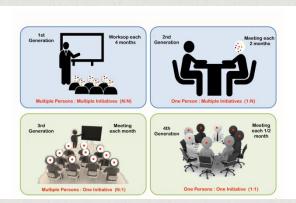


Fig. 2: Comparison of the four generations in the personal strategy

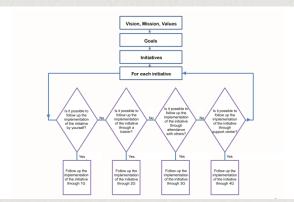


Fig. 3: Flowchart of the four generations in the personal strategy

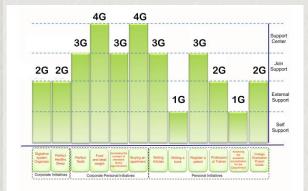


Fig. 4: Initiatives and their actions on the four generations in the personal strategy

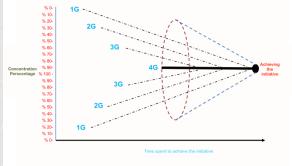


Fig. 5: The concentration percentage of the four generations on the personal strategy

4th Generation:

The 4th generation of personal strategy represents the central motivational aspect: a specialized scientific team is formed to support the member in achieving the initiative with logistical support in documentation, research and design.
